Activities range in age appropriateness and skill level so that teachers can choose activities that best suit their particular students. An Answer Key is provided on the last page.




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Dino Chain Reaction







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

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Draw Your Own Stegosaurus



Dinosaur Facts

- 1. Not all huge prehistoric animals were dinosaurs.
 - Prehistoric animals also included megalodon sharks which were 40-52 feet long. These sharks weighed anywhere from 20 to 30 tons and in some cases as much as 60 tons. There were also woolly mammoths that had ivory tusks about 16 feet long.



- 3. Not all dinosaurs were huge. Although there were giant dinosaurs like Brachiosaurus brancai, there were other dinosaurs that were about the sizes of chickens. These dinosaurs were the microraptor and the parvicurson.
- 4. People did not coexist with dinosaurs. Fiction stories inaccurately promoted the image of human cave dwellers hunting dinosaurs. People didn't exist until about 65 million years after the dinosaurs' extinction. However, some religious people believed that everything on earth was created at the same time so humans and dinosaurs would have lived together. There is no scientific proof or support for these beliefs.
- 5. The dinosaurs didn't all live at the same time. The dinosaurs roamed the Earth for about 165 million years. Different types of dinosaurs existed at different times.
- 6. Not all the dinosaurs became extinct 165 million years ago. Some prehistoric birds survived the mass extinction. In China, feathered dinosaur fossils have been discovered and may be the missing link to modern birds. Technically there are still dinosaurs living today because birds evolved from dinosaurs.
- 7. Some dinosaurs are now believed to be warm blooded. New evidence shows that some dinosaurs thrived in cooler temperature climates, which suggests that they were warm blooded. Fossils were even found in Antarctica. Scientists have also studied the blood vessel cavities in dinosaur bones. These studies further suggest that some dinosaurs were in fact warm blooded and led active lives. However, this subject is still a topic of debate among scientists.


