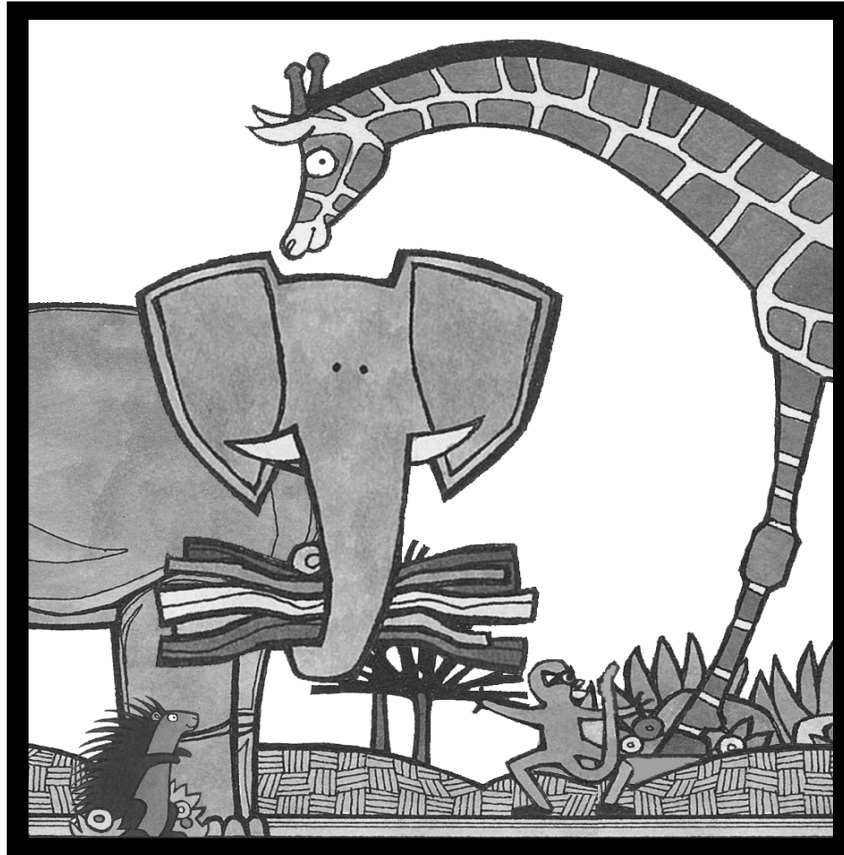

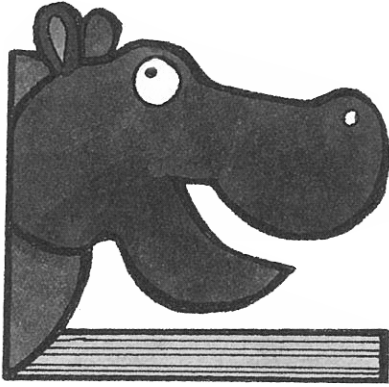


## Supplemental Activities Workbook

# HOW ARE YOU UNIQUE?

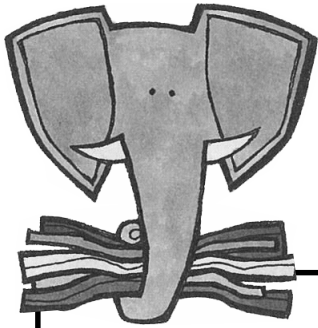
